

USP College – Provider Access Policy Statement

At USP College, our mission is to connect young people to both great career pathways and alternative training, through exciting work and learning opportunities. Whilst we have researched job opportunities in the UK and have a good understanding of local career options within Essex, we continue to build this knowledge by gaining further support through engagement with local and national employers, training providers and educators.

Our Provider Access Policy Statement sets out the College's continued arrangements for providing access to external organisations for the purpose of supporting the learners with their career and learning development. This complies with the legal obligations set within the Careers guidance and access for education and training providers produced in January 2023, as well as 'Section 42B of the Education Act 1997'.

Student Entitlement

All USP learners are entitled to:

- Find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeship opportunities, as part of a Careers, Education, Information, Advice and Guidance (CEIAG) programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point.
- Hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education, apprenticeships and direct employment routes through options events, group discussions, taster events, HE, careers fairs, alongside virtual offerings.
- Understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses, progressions, and employment routes.
